Shrine Mont is a conference center of the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia. Each Memorial Day weekend, St. John's offers a weekend away at Shrine Mont, which is nestled among the trees at the foot of Great North Mountain in the Shenandoah Valley. We arrive in Orkney Springs, Virginia, on Saturday in time for lunch and stay through noonish on Monday. We offer organized activities ranging from bubbles to wine-tasting, combined with a unique opportunity to escape from the busyness of life.



What Can I Do at Shrine Mont?

Learn how to tie-dye, paint a rock, catch salamanders, fish, play tennis, softball, basketball or soccer, join in the Family Olympics. Go swimming, do a little dancing, hike to the Shrine, or spend the entire weekend in a rocking chair, knitting, reading a book or visiting with friends. Our Sunday worship service is casual and comfortable, and we take time on Monday to remember and honor those who died in the armed forces fighting to keep our country safe and free.
